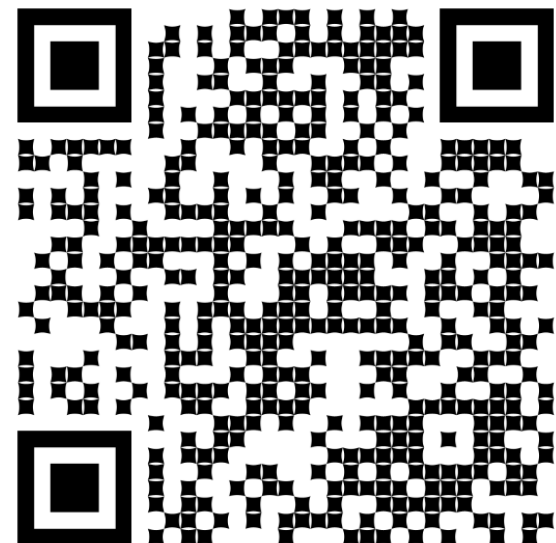

Rev. Prof. Eusebio F. González, S.Th.D. Associate Professor of Biblical Theology at the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross in Rome (Pontificia Università della Santa Croce). Born on February 2, 1971 in Madrid. He graduated in Theology from the University of Navarra and holds a doctorate in Theology from the PUSC. He specializes in Biblical Theology and Ancient Languages. Author of numerous scholarly publications.



Rev. Prof. Waldemar Chrostowski, Outstanding Polish biblical scholar and theologian. Born on February 1, 1951. He studied at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem (1978-1983). He lectured at the Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński University in Warsaw and at the Nicolaus Copernicus University in Toruń. He specializes in Old Testament exegesis and Christian-Jewish dialogue. In the years 2003-2013 he was a chairman of the Association of Polish Biblical Scholars. He is the author of over 3,000 scholarly and popular publications. In 2014 he was awarded the Vatican Ratzinger Prize, awarded to the most outstanding theologians in the world.
